UNIT COMMANDER OF 53 DIVISION

Greetings, Happy New Year and welcome to the January 2009 edition of our 53 Division Community Bulletin.

On behalf of our police officers, civilian staff and members of our Community Police Liaison Committee, I invite you to join us here at **53 Division, 75 Eglinton Ave. W.** on **Sunday January 11th between 12 Noon and 4 P.M.** for our **2009 New Year's Levee**. Please join us for refreshments, presentations and some special attractions for the kids. The Toronto Transit Commission has kindly provided the special event bus bay, on the east side of Duplex Ave. south of Eglinton Ave., for parking. There will be Toronto Police Auxiliary Officers outside to assist with parking and traffic direction.

During 2008 reported incidents of crime in 53 Division, based on the seven major crime categories, decreased an average of 5%. However reported occurrences of Assault increased by 17 incidents and Robbery by 8. We had one homicide compared with two during 2007. Although Personal Injury collisions decreased an average of 13%, tragically, five of these resulted in fatalities. Property damage collisions also decreased, by 4%, compared with 2007. Please drive, cycle and walk with care and courtesy and be sure to adapt your driving style to allow for winter road and weather conditions. Let's allow ourselves enough time to get to where we're going safely.

Our Divisional uniform and civilian staff look forward to working with you during 2009 to prevent and reduce crime and victimization even further in order to ensure that our community remains safe, secure and liveable.

I bring to your attention two troubling trends that are on the increase, residential **Break and Enters** and **'Warm Up' Thefts**.

We have been experiencing Break and Enters in residences equipped with alarm systems that were not activated, or where doors were closed but not locked. Please ensure when leaving your home, for whatever duration, that doors are locked and, that if applicable, your alarm system is activated.

Finally, it is very tempting during the cold weather to start your motor vehicle and return to your residence while it warms up. This is an open invitation to car thieves, who drive around specifically on the look out for idling, unoccupied motor vehicles to steal. Remember, even if your vehicle doors are locked, a competent car thief can get in with a 'Slim Jim' or other such device as quickly as you can unlock it with your key or remote. Don't be a victim of a 'Warm Up' theft. **Never leave an unoccupied vehicle running.**

What is the Toronto Anti-Violence Intervention Strategy?

The Toronto Anti-Violence Intervention Strategy, or **TAVIS** for short, is the plan that the Toronto Police Service is using to reduce violence and fear in neighbourhoods. The plan uses *community mobilization* to:

- reduce crime and disorder,
- make neighbourhoods safer, and
- bring neighbours together to keep their neighbourhood safe and liveable.

How does TAVIS work?

Your local division is the frontline of TAVIS; all officers are involved. Your neighbourhood has been assigned a Neighbourhood Officer. This officer is now working with people in your neighbourhood to find lasting solutions to crime and disorder issues.

The Neighbourhood Officer, community members and other service providers in the neighbourhood are:

- identifying crime and disorder issues,
- developing strategies to address these issues,
- implementing these plans, and
- monitoring the effectiveness of the plans.

All officers of the Toronto Police Service, including the four Rapid Response Teams, the Toronto Drug Squad, the Gun and Gang Task Force, and Intelligence Services, support the divisions in carrying out the neighbourhood plans.

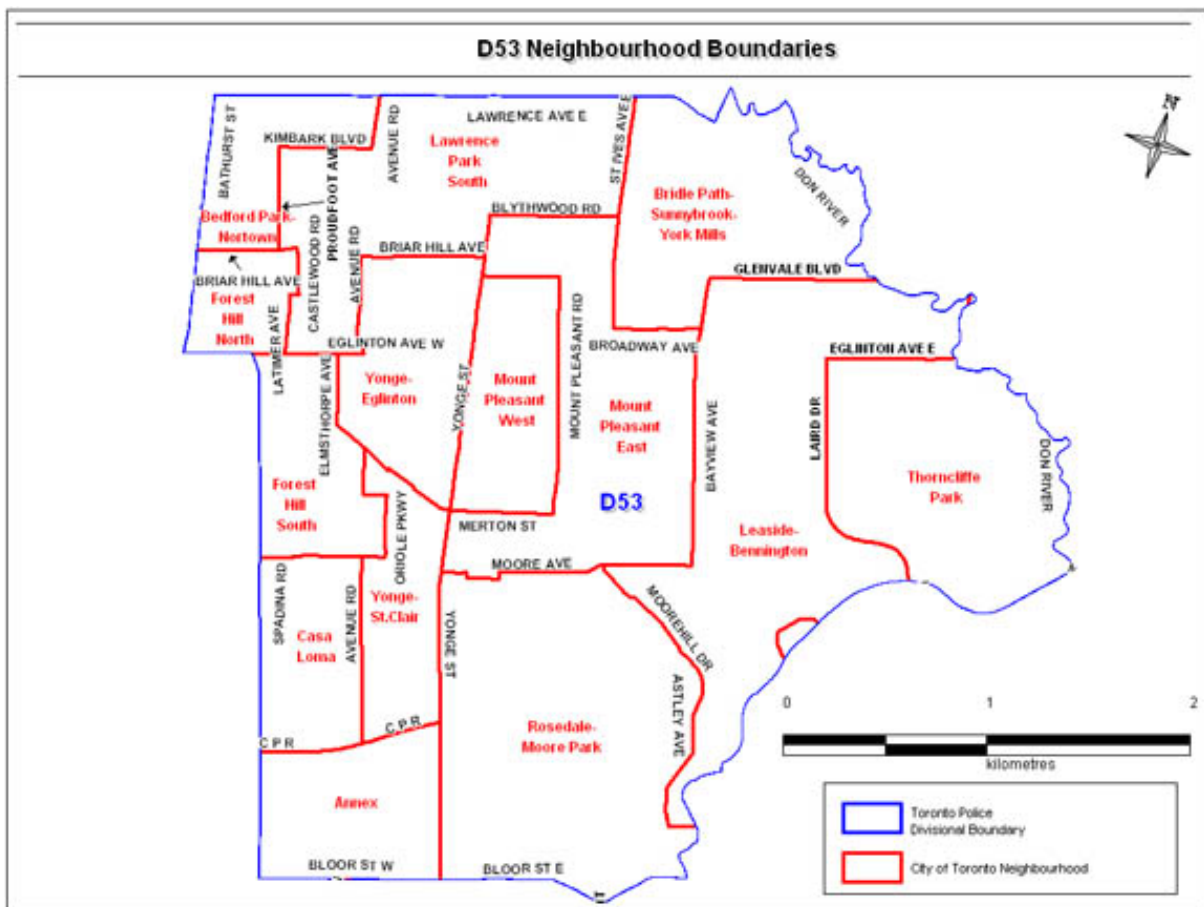


Neighbourhoods in the 53 Division

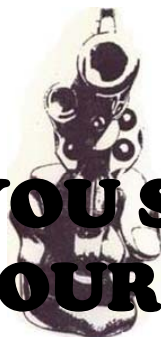



MAJOR ARRESTS



ELDER ABUSE

Arrested and investigated by Members of No. 53 Division.

During the period from 2005 to 2008, a female suspect had been employed by a female victim as a live-in-caregiver with the responsibility of cashing the victim's cheques. Recently, it came to the attention of the family members of the victim that approximately \$40,000.00 has gone missing from the victim's bank account in the past two months. Subsequent to the investigation, the suspect was identified and on December 2, 2008, suspect was arrested. At the time of the arrest, suspect was found to be in possession of stolen and forged cheques belonging to the victim. The investigation is continuing.

Charged with fraud over \$5000, uttering a forged document, forgery and possession of property obtained by crime under \$5000 is **Gracia LUCZON**, 31 years of Toronto. She was held for a show cause hearing at College Park Courts to answer to the charges.

ATTEMPT BREAK & ENTER

On Thursday December 4th 2008 at 4:25am a resident on MacPherson Ave noticed that the back gate to his property was open. The shadow of a male was also seen lurking around the front door of his premise.

The complainant called the police and then he armed himself with a broom fearing the suspect would actually gain entry.

Police responded and observed the suspect at the front door of the residence.

The suspect was arrested and at the time refused to identify himself to the officers. He was transported to 53 Division for further investigation.

Charged with prowl by night, attempt break & enter and fail to comply with probation is **Ryan SALZMANN**, 27 years of Toronto. He was held for a show cause hearing at College Park Courts to answer to the charges.

On Friday, December 26, 2008, police started an investigation into an alleged sexual assault.

It is alleged that the suspect is a professional boxing coach and the victim, a 21-year-old-woman was a student.

Between Friday, February 1, 2008 and Wednesday, December 24, 2008, the suspect sexually assaulted the victim.

Adrian Teodorescu, 65, of Toronto, has been charged with:

- 1) Forcible Confinement,
- 2) Eight counts of sexual assault,
- 3) Threatening Death,
- 4) Assault,
- 5) Forcible Confinement,
- 6) Criminal Harassment.

The suspect appeared in College Park Courts to answer to the charges.

Police believe there may be other victims.

BREAK & ENTER

On Tuesday December 23rd 2008, shortly after midnight the two suspects attended a Condominium building on Elm Avenue.

They gained access to the building and made their way to the laundry room. Using the pry bar and wire they had brought with them, they began to break into the coin-operated washing machines.

They were successful in removing a large amount of change from the machines. As they were leaving the laundry room, they were confronted by one of the residents of the building at which time they both fled the building.

Both suspects were transported to 53 Division for further investigation.

Robbery (Mugging) - 53 Division

A 73 year old male reports that on December 9, 2008 between 1415 hours and 1430 hours, he was in a public washroom in the area of Don Mills Road and Thorncliffe Park Drive when he observed three males exiting a washroom stall. Two of these males were assaulting the third male. One of the suspects produced a can of pepper spray and sprayed this male. The suspect then turned towards the victim and sprayed him in the face. 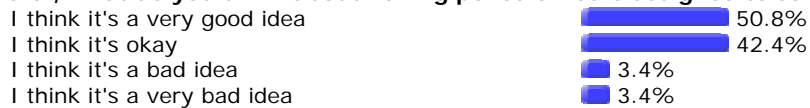

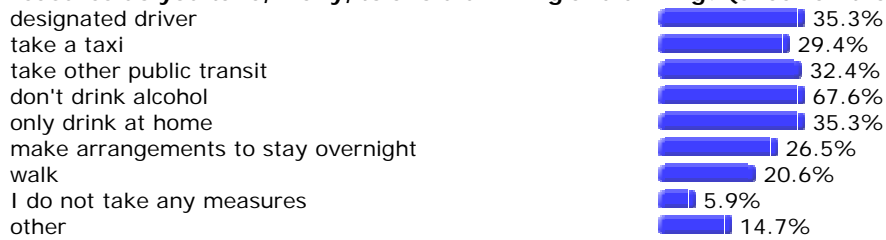

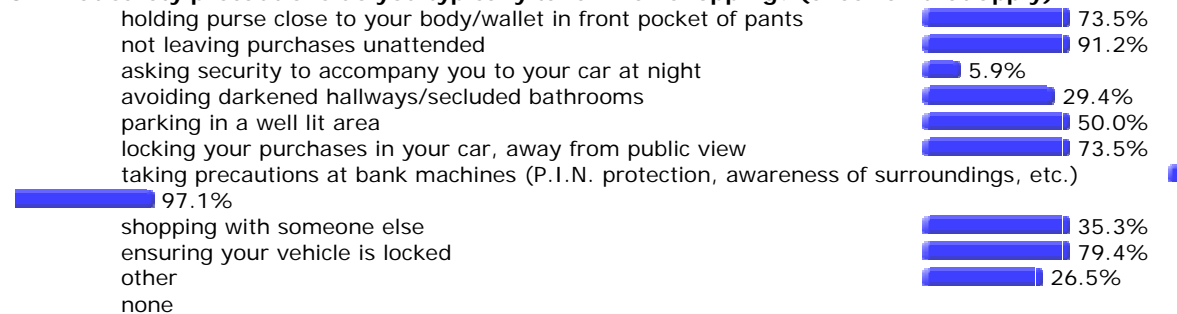
1. Are you aware of the Festive R.I.D.E. Program?



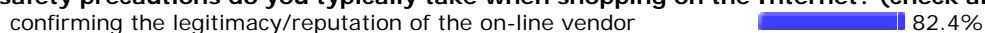
2. What measures do you take, if any, to avoid drinking and driving? (check all that apply)



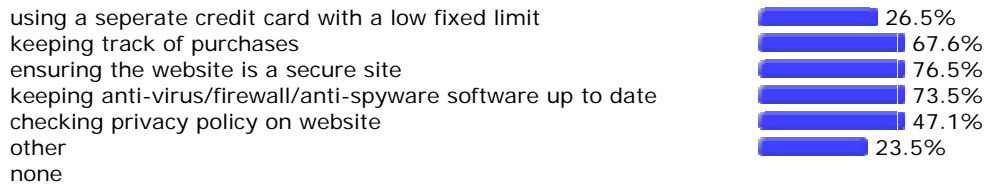
3. What safety precautions do you typically take when shopping? (check all that apply)

YOU CAN PROTECT YOURSELF

A number of prevention measures can be taken so that your risk of becoming a victim is minimized. We strongly recommend that the 12-step program listed on the reverse, which specifically addresses this crime problem, is followed by all members of your household.

DON'T BE AN EASY TARGET

- **Lock your windows and doors, especially basement windows, rear ground floor windows and patio doors.**
- **Most windows can be pinned for security by drilling a 3/16" hole on a slight downward slant through the inside window frame and halfway into the outside frame – place a nail/pin in the hole to secure the window.**
- **Sliding glass doors/windows can be lifted out of their tracks with relative ease. Install self-tapping screws in the upper track that allow the door/window to slide into place. Place a piece of wood into the bottom track – this will resist lateral forcing.**

- **Maintain control of your vehicle keys at all times, both at and away from home. Do not place them in routine and usual locations, e.g. foyers, kitchen counters or in purses.**
 - **Leave a ground floor light and radio on during the night.**
 - **Consider placing a cellular telephone in your bedroom in event that your telephone lines are tampered with. Call 911 if you hear an intruder in your home. DO NOT CONFRONT INTRUDERS.**
 - **If you have a garage, use it to park your car and lock it. If you do not have a garage or can not park in it and have more than one car, always park the most expensive one ahead of the other one.**
 - **Participate in the 'LIGHT THE NIGHT' crime prevention initiative in 53 Division, by joining with your neighbours in leaving all of your exterior lights on all night. Increased night-time illumination will act as a natural deterrent to these offenders who utilize the cover of darkness to their full criminal advantage. Additionally, position a motion detector light in your driveway and at the rear of your home.**
 - **If your home has an alarm system, arm the perimeter portion during the night while you are asleep.**
 - **Ensure that your home alarm panel is not visible from exterior doors or windows, by moving it or covering it. It is important that potential intruders do not know that the alarm system is on or off.**
 - **Invest in a cellular based vehicle tracking system for your car. This is very important, as it will allow the police to locate your car and possibly arrest those responsible if your car is stolen. As the offenders are obtaining the car keys, anti-theft car devices, such as alarms and car-disabling locks for ignition, fuel and other systems are being defeated. Note: cars fitted with a tracking system are typically eligible for auto insurance discounts as well.**
 - **Be aware of suspicious persons and vehicles in your neighbourhood, especially in the evening and overnight hours and report suspicious activities immediately to the police.**
